lite joined HM.S Begun at Belfast a arrier of about 18,000 tons in the hanger was 20 hellcats, on the flight leck was 24 Baracudas. The sea was ruff, when we got into the med it was terribly ruff the paraveins were out for fart of the way we passed Portugal, just see a faint at line of it fishralta. The most interesting piece was when we came up the suez. Hear and there were bright little port of villages with pollm trees, it looked celmost like heaven, the camels were walking along the side of the canal with loads of oranges wowmen in gay colourd clothing with putchers on these heads, The olours are just inposible to escaplain, it was just like one huge oir paintings the natives working are almost slaves, they stand over them with whips, just the same as in

the old days. There were a few natives abound selling walets and what nots I bought one We dropped anchor just in the lay of Port Tewfic We were here four four days only 75 were allowed a shore a time from out ship owing to the Plague, which only left one or two streets in bounds even if we did go. It is very difficult to get used to the money they use, we could twist them with our money but where we used theres & think that they got there own back, up too now we have clone the 19th nothing much shappend today the weather is very hot, the ship noved a little further into port.

now, but still are not allowed to go a shore there Rotheing much hopend today 100 ratings went ashore instead of Mr. The ship is now under sailing orders, po where we shall go from hear I don't know, the weather is still very hot. I had a nice bose of Turkish delights today. We have putted started off again today we are now in the Red sea the weather is very blot, and there are mounty on both sides of us. 24/3/44 Not much change today land seems further off and the weather is practicaly unbeared the smell of the sund scorehin on the flight deck and the steel decks are almost red

at times. trapical clothery is being worn now. No one can explain what the heat and conditions 25/3/44/ Still getting warmer in fact most of the fellows are takeing there beds and sleening Today the Indian navy came along side with a destroyer and post a message to over Ship by means of a rope and bottle. The sea has hardly a riple on it, there is a heavy heat have all the way over it, with the sur blazing on it you have a job to look at it with your maked eye. They try to give as cooling food his we had tornatives corned but leture for super, all served with ice, but still it was warm Le3/44. It is still getting warmer today I had to go too the sick bay with discentary, I get medicine times a daily I feel rotten This morally we could see land on the port side of the ship 27/3/44 a pretty place but not quile so pictures of as the others we had seen, none of us went ashore the ship refuled with oil und drinking water, We managed to get hold of some water melons and bananois, the ship was no mare than un hundred yards from the shopes; we could see the carrels in the streets, There was 20 Black out there and all the colourd lights at night made et look like a circus, we could see. garden parties goines on with lights strung from tree to tree, the weather there is still very hot

28/3/44. Today everyone one seemed to be in a flat spin, we have had a submarine warning, we we are out of the red sea now, its a bit ruffer sæiling now. Today the weather is very hot the ship is rolling and purhaging quite a but the sea is rather unsetted, we had action str at qualir to five this morning let had a cold dinner, tomato letice and beat not, onion salad. For sweet we had bunarias. Today the sea is calm weather just as hat clear sailing today There are several cases of the sich boy with sun born & have just finished attending the rich buy myself. We got chords Toolsey from the cantion because it wont keep in the hot weather Its cept in the refrigeration

We came into the Inclian Ocean on the 29 mm. 31/3/44 Today the sea was very calm and the weather very hot we havent done much all day only lie around in the sun then are several fellow attending sich bay with sun burn blisters, lete should reach our destination on Tuesday today is soiteday Today the weather was very hold but the sea was calm. The clocks were just on an how 2/4/44
Soday the weather just as hot the pilet on the flight hot the pilet on the flight deck is all running, the clocks have been put on another half as hour today, Today at about 7 oclock in the morning we reached below, we are

in the howsbowd not very for from bulumbo, we can see ill quito lear the weather is very hot. We went 4/1/10th ashore in the afternoon and had to a good time we got pingapple banarias & cocorruts, But the heat on the streets made every thing have such horrid smells hear and there 44 44 Today we did notherner much only round about on the flight lak in the sun, it is very hot we ire still in the harbour of belon. 1444 Today I went as hope again nd had a most lovely time. We went wright into the native quaters today only the two of us. We went into the area that we are barred rgainst, we were going ito the Temple a magifisent building but we thought some one would swipe our books when we look them off to yo in the wa chave all been warned about eating in native resturents

and eating pealed fruit for our own safety, I bought too black elephents 14/44 The couldn't go out Koday Do clone some washing the Sweather is still very hold but the sky looks very suncertain. We went ashore loday but now one could have all night leave. I bought a pair of elephons and notive nechlace we had a g. 14.144 I nice bowl of ice cream The usual daily rutine nothering much unusual hapend only that it pourd with rain 1/4144, at sise oclock we started on our way again it es just pouring with rain, one minute it stops and dres ye in no time. 10/4/44 To day we had anoth every thing smell so I swel and need 1 11/4/44 Shis morning we entered the harbour of Madras it looks a beautiful place we are getting off hear, but the squadron is going in land quite a bit & expect & f shall go ashore tomorrow the order? are yards of them, by reacting, them it sounds as if it is hell of a place, there is no allnight leave to myork, it also says that all cases of theft and thoires are to be reported ashere. So untill temorrow? 12/4/44) & went ashore today and had a marvelous time, these were three of us together, its very nice to visit these places, but too hell with liveing in them permanent like had a little clark boy to show us around naturally he took as right into the nature part, market, housing, and

when it gets dusk they just wash their swede down any where in the streets oh the pravment anywhere. The ocen is treated as an holy animal, athey are roaming about and everywhere. But side I the temple there were natives beating drums and playing all kinds of Endian instruments I while the others prayed, but the beggans about is something wicked deformed, they should be destroyed for there own hapiness, its terrible to look at ke them. ? 13/4/44. muck, stayed on the ship, the weather is very hot. 04/4/44. 'soday they had a lot of th æ 4.T.s gerls abound too show them over the carrier, also the Indianale not down in the airchaft elevatures no just like little hids holding

on to one another We left the ship tonight at 4 oclock and traveld all right untill we reached our destination which evas about 630 in the morning we frasted, no end of dense farest, junble and huge sevenyrg. camp this norning our heets are made of bamboo, they are te not half as bad as they were made out to be, in fact I like them, 'She natives you though, on the other hadthe they will do anything for a you . The velage near this camp we are burned from rol Le owing to certain complaints ra(and deseases.
